Daryl Giuliano

Cellist Daryl Giuliano is quickly developing her career as soloist and chamber musician with a passion for music that has brought her to study in Paris, France and now to London, England where she is pursuing her Master of Music degree at the Royal Academy of Music in the studio of Felix Schmidt.

Originally from Canada, she began her studies at the piano before beginning the cello at the age of twelve with Glenn Fischbach in the United States. In 2005, Daryl won the Armstrong Atlantic Youth Orchestra's Concerto Competition and performed as soloist with them the following spring. Since that time, she has also appeared as soloist with the Amici Symphony Orchestra and the Orchestre du Conservatoire de Bourg-la-Reine/Sceaux.

She has performed in master classes for Maria Kliegel, Anssi Karttunen, Robert Cohen, Colin Carr, Mihai Tetel, Michel Strauss, Valérie Aimard, Andres Diaz, Jeffrey Solow, Astrid Schween, and Manuel Fischer-Dieskau.

Daryl recently formed the Ondine Quartet which successfully gained a place in the Davey Poznanski Quartet Scheme at the Academy with intensive quartet coachings and concert opportunities. The Ondine Quartet has performed at the Royal Academy of Music, Charlton House, and has collaborated with the Vickers-Bovey Guitar Duo as part of the RAM Club Prize Award.

Daryl has debuted "Tango for Solo Cello" by Douglas Farrell and "Suite Tectonic" by Hanna Lisa Steffanson. As a chamber musician, she has concertized with Chamber Cartel, a new-music ensemble based in Atlanta, Georgia. She has also recorded for a pop album for the group Besides Daniel, and given concerts with Magnets and Ghosts, Besides Daniel, and Tealights.

Recent performances include duos recitals at the Tom Woods Cello Shop and the Latvian Embassy in London as well as trio performances at the Draper's Hall, St. Barnabas Ealing, and St. James's Piccadilly, with the Beethoven Piano Society of Europe. Upcoming concerts include performances at Burgh House and St. Mary the Virgin, Aylesbury.

Russian-born pianist based in London Julia Sinani has performed extensively in the UK and Russia both as a soloist and chamber musician.

Since the tender age of 5 she has taken part in concerts in all major concert halls of Moscow. Ever since, she has performed extensively as solo pianist, accompanist and in chamber music ensembles in many cities in Russia and Europe, particularly in the halls of Moscow and St. Petersburg. She was also keyboard player for the symphony orchestra of the Central Music School of Moscow. While in Russia, she took part in various concert programmes of Vladimir Spivakov's Charitable Fund and was selected to participate in many master-classes, most notably with Nikolai Petrov.

Since moving to London, Julia is in demand both as a soloist and chamber musician – having partnered several instrumentalists and vocalists at the Royal Academy, she has received offers from professional musicians to accompany them at competitions, public and private performances. She has been a permanent feature of an annual Pushkin in Britain Festival since 2011, which led to her performing at the Russian Embassy in London as well as many other venues around the capital.

Julia won numerous music competitions and after graduating with Honours from the Central Music School in Moscow, was awarded a scholarship to study at the Royal Academy of Music in London where she is currently completing an MA in piano accompaniment.
